KQ4 What does the map need to include to make it easier to read?



compass points	An instrument for showing direction.
aerial photographs	A photograph taken from the air.
perspective	a way of showing objects on the flat surface of a picture so that they seem the correct size and distance from one another.
landmarks	A historic building, important place.
symbols	Object or picture to represent something.
key	A little box of information found at the bottom of a map. It contains an explanation of what the different lines and symbols on the map mean,
human features	Something built by humans.
city	A place where people live that is larger than a town.
town	A place where people live that is smaller than a city but bigger than a village.
village	A small community in a countryside area.



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
