What should I already know about

Vocabulary

Neolithic - Also known as New Stone Age, where humans domesticated animals and lived in permanent settlements.

Bronze Age - The period after the Stone Age, where people used Bronze, an alloy metal to make weapons and tools.

Iron Age – The period after the Bronze Age, where people used Iron metal to make weapons and tools.

settlement - People start to settle in once place and live together as communities.

roundhouse - A circular building used as a dwelling with a thatched roof.

tribe – A group of people who live and work together in the same geographical area. They share a common culture, dialect and religion.

domestication – Tame animals to keep as pets and to cultivate.

archaeologists - A person who studies human history by visiting ancient sites and looking at artefacts

artefacts - Objects that were made and used by humans from the past.
