# School Meals

The school menu has changed and is on the school website and on ParentPay.

Please look at the new menu with your child(ren) and ask them what meals they would like for the week.

\*Please note - if your child receives school dinners but you do not choose a meal for them on ParentPay, then they will receive jacket potato.

This is why it is important to choose meals in advance.

The dinner register is taken every morning in class. If a child is not present when the dinner register is taken, then they are marked as absent. If they arrive late after this point, then they will receive jacket potato and not their chosen meal. This is because the kitchen can only prepare the chosen meals for students who are marked as present when the dinner register is taken. Extra jacket potato's are made daily for children who arrive late.

Please ensure your child(ren) are on time everyday so they can receive their chosen meal.

All children from Reception to year 6 are entitled to receive a free school meal. However, if your child prefers they can still bring a healthy packed lunch instead.

Please ensure you have no meal debt on ParentPay from previous years as this will prevent you booking your child's free meal.

If you have any questions about your child's school dinner or need help booking on ParentPay, please ring the school and choose option 4 (fm 9.30am-2.30pm) and we will be happy to assist you. Thank you.

### \* REMINDERS \*

Please do not leave any scooters or bicycles unattended on school premises. If they are left in the school, please <u>use the bike shed</u> to store them and ensure that they are safely locked up. The school cannot take any responsibility for lost or damaged items.

Please ensure your child brings a water bottle to school everyday. It's very important that kids stay hydrated throughout the day regardless of the weather. Please also ensure your child <u>does not</u> wear earrings on PE day as it is a safety hazard.

#### Kew Gardens

Over the last couple of weeks of Autumn 1, all three Year 3 classes visited Kew Gardens as part of their learning in geography and art. While at Kew Gardens, the children measured soil temperature both outside and inside the Palm House, which gave them the experience of being in a tropical rainforest. ### <u>Attendance</u>

If your child is unable to attend school, for any reason, please let us know. Please email:

absence@tops.hounslow.sch.uk Or telephone the school on 020 8570 6247 and leave a voicemail message on the absence line by choosing Option 2. 'Sick' or 'unwell' cannot be accepted as a reason so please provide as much detail (symptoms) as possible. If your child does feel generally unwell in the morning before school, we encourage them to come into school, and if needed, the welfare officer will call you if your child is not well enough to stay in school.
