Children who are eligible for benefits and income related Free School Meals (FSM), are currently also eligible for Free School Meal vouchers (Evouchers) in the school holidays to help with the cost of food shopping and fun holiday activities (HAF). #### STAY SAFE

We remind all parents/carers and children to be careful on their way to and from school

If walking, please be road aware; keep to the pavements and look out for moving cars and bicycles/scooters when crossing the road.

Please hold your child's hand and do not allow your child to run between the cars in the school carpark, but follow the path at the edge especially at the end of the day.

#### Term Time Leave

The law requires that ALL children of school age attend school every day unless s/he is ill or there are exceptional circumstances. For this reason, parents should always arrange visits to family, including those in other countries, during the school holidays. If you feel that you need to take your child out of school during term time please discuss this with the school before finalising any

arrangements. A 'Term Time Leave' form is available in the school office and we ask that this is

completed with all details of absence/travel prior to leave being taken.

We monitor the absence of all children and you are likely to be required to have a meeting with the Headteacher or the Attendance Support Officer, either before or after time away from school, to discuss all term time absence.

Where these term time absences are not authorized, the absence will be referred to the Local Authority (LBH) and parents may incur a fixed penalty warning notice or a fine.

If your child is unable to attend school, for It your child is unable to attend school, for any reason, please let us know. Please email: <u>absence@tops.hounslow.sch.uk</u> OR telephone the school on 020 8570 6247 and leave a voicemail message on the absence line by choosing Option 2. 'sick' or 'unwell' cannot be accepted as a reason so please provide as much detail (symptoms) as possible. If your child does feel generally unwell in the morn-ing before school we encourage them to ing before school, we encourage them to come into school, and if needed, the welfare officer will call you if your child is not well enough to stay in school.


Absence of a child due to parents ill health or that of a relative, is not an acceptable reason for a child to not be in school.
