It was an unusual start to the school day on Tuesday 28 January for Cedar Class, who are one of the year 4 classes. The day started at 8:10am. This was so that they could avoid the traffic of west London to reach Pizza Express, Kew, in no time. Miss Wadge, a member of the office team, said 'It's wonderful that the children got to go to Pizza Express for the first time at Orchard School.'



On arrival, the managers, Gosia and Aitanna, and chefs, Biagio and Conrad, welcomed the children. The children were soon kitted out in essential outfit for cooking: an apron and a matching chef's hat.
