SCHOOL UNIFORM

Dear parents

We thought it would be very useful to remind all families about the need to wear school uniform every day. Please see the school uniform list below:

As well as school uniform the children also need a PE kit which should be kept in a labelled bag at school.

It is our school policy that all children should wear school uniform when attending school or participating in a school-organised event.

Our policy is based on the principles that a school uniform:

- promotes a sense of pride in the school;
 - engenders a feeling of community and belonging;
 - is practical and smart;
 - identifies the children with the school;
 - is not distracting in class (as fashion clothes might be);
 - makes children feel equal to their peers in terms of appearance;
 - is regarded as suitable, and good value for money, by most parents and carers;
 - has been designed with health and safety in mind.
- We do not allow children to wear jewellery to school for health and safety reasons. The exceptions to this are small stud earrings in pierced ears and one small object of religious significance such as a crucifix on a chain or a Kara. We do ask the children to either remove these objects during PE and games or to cover them with a plaster. Watches, although not necessary, are permitted in the Key Stage 2 classes, worn at the pupil's own risk.
 - We ask that all children wear shoes to school and wear their trainers for PE lessons. Trainers are appropriate for sport or playtimes but are not in keeping with the smart appearance of our school uniform. It is also dangerous for children to wear shoes that have high heels or platform soles and so do not allow children to wear such shoes in school.
